



# May is Rotary Youth Service Month

Gentle reminder: This Sunday is Mother's Day!

since the mid-1800's, various people (mostly women) have tried to garner support for a special day to recognize and honor mothers. Sporadic celebrations were set aside in a few communities and churches. In 1910, Anna Jarvis' campaign resulted in the official declaration of the holiday by the state of West Virginia; other states soon followed suit. On May 10, 1913, the US House of Representatives passed a resolution calling on all federal government officials to wear a white carnation in honor of Mother's Day. The following year, the observation of Mother's Day was designated as the second Sunday in May.
